Create a container-free "naturescape" with three earthen elements: log, rock, succulent, lichen, bark, foliage, moss, etc. Will be displayed on a 40" pedestal with a 15" square top. Entry must be draped.

Class 2: (6 entries)

### Connect Your Chakra

Create a vibrant monochromatic floral design expressing an energy flow that connects to one of the seven major Chakras in the body. Choose a color: red, yellow, blue, orange, purple, green. To be displayed on a 35" pedestal with a 15" square top. Must be a minimum of 24" x 24" and draped.

Class 3: (5 entries)

### Connecting the World

Decorate your front door entrance with an international flair! Showcase culture through the language of flowers and the flag of the country. Designer to provide wreath hanger. ## INSTRUCTIONS

- Non-judged exhibits
- Exhibitors must sign-up to participate by contacting the class advisor.
- Check-in at McDonough Sports Complex FRONT entrance on Thursday, March 27th between 8am-6pm; must be finished by 8am Friday, March 28.
- No artificial plant or floral material permitted. No artificial turf. No lit candles, no running water, no flyers, no signs. Business cards (in a holder) at the exhibit are acceptable and encouraged.
- Before leaving, remove any tape markers from the floor, fluff the drape behind your exhibit, remove all trash and sweep your area.
- Your exhibit must remain in place and fully intact until Sunday, March 30 at 5pm. Arrangements not picked up by 7pm will be discarded.
- Your exhibit must be kept in pristine condition for the duration of the show. You may refresh your work each morning from 8:30am-9:45am. An exhibit (that is tired or droopy) may be removed at the discretion of show management.
- Exhibitors will receive an exhibitor badge to enter the show during all show hours, plus two single day guest passes.
